Observations on Church

- 1. There are 195 million non-churched people in America, making America one of the top 4 largest "unchurched" nations in the world.
- 2. In spite of the rise of mega-churches, no county in America has a greater church population than it did 10 years ago.
- 3. During the last 10 years, combined communicant membership of all Protestant denominations declined by 9.5%, while the national population increased by 11.4%.
- 4. Each year 3,500 to 4,000 churches close their doors forever; yet only as many as 1,500 new churches are started.
- 5. There are now nearly 60% fewer churches per 1,000 persons than in 1920.
 - * In 1920, 27 churches existed for every 10,000 Americans.
 - * In 1950, 17 churches existed for every 10,000 Americans.
 - * In 1996, 11 churches existed for every 10,000 Americans.
- 6. Today, of the approximately 350,000 churches in America, 4 out of 5 are either plateaued or declining.
- 7. One American denomination recently found that 80% of its converts came to Christ in churches less than 2 years old.
- Hence the claim of many leaders: "The single most effective evangelistic methodology under heaven is planting new churches." (Peter Wagner)

THE CHURCH IS IN DECLINE

Churches in our region of the country are closing at a phenomenal rate. Dr. Win Arn reports that 3,500 to 4,000 churches close each year across our nation, and a large percentage of them that do so are right here in the Mid-Atlantic. Many of the churches in our area that are experiencing numerical growth are doing so through transfer growth, not conversion growth. This means that the overall net effect is decline.

THE CHURCH HAS LOST ITS SALTINESS

Too many churches in our region are not producing obedient, Christlike disciples. Sadly, the lifestyle of a large percentage of professing Christians matches that of unbelievers in our culture.

THE CHURCH HAS LOST ITS SENSE OF MISSION

The Mid-Atlantic culture is becoming increasingly post-Christian. Therefore, more Christians are needed to go into the culture and both embody the gospel and contextualize its message. Not doing this will mean failure to reach our culture and the coming generations.
